With its four interfaces, the d2 Quadra is universally compatible with almost any computer and can be daisy-chained with peripherals or expanded via FireWire.

Engineered to fit seamlessly in to any work environment, the LaCie d2 Quadra can be stood vertically on the LaCie Drive Stand (included), placed in the LaCie Desk Rack (sold separately) or incorporated into standard 19" computer equipment racks with the LaCie Rackmount Kit (sold separately).

The improved passive heat dissipation design by Neil Poulton provides natural cooling by increasing the surface area over which heat can leave the d2 Quadra for better thermal regulation and longer life.


1.3. Views of the d2 Quadra

Push the Shortcut Button to launch the document or application of your choice (see the LaCie Shortcut Button User Manual for more information).


The LED remains lit to show that the drive is on, and blinks to indicate drive activity.

1.4. Cables and Connectors


1.4.1. FireWire 400 and 800 Cables and Connectors

FireWire 400, also known as IEEE 1394, is a high-speed serial input/output technology for connecting peripheral devices to a computer or to each other, and FireWire 800 is the implementation of the new IEEE 1394b standard.

FireWire 800 offers increased bandwidth and extended distance between devices. FireWire 800 is ideal for bandwidth-intensive applications, such as audio, video and graphics.

Included FireWire Cables

Your LaCie d2 Quadra comes with a FireWire 400 cable and a FireWire 800 cable.



FireWire Benefits

- Hot-pluggable: devices can be added and removed while the bus is active.
- Isochronous data delivery: no dropped frames FireWire supports real-time data delivery.
- Flexible: up to 63 devices can be connected on a single bus.
- FireWire 800 reduces delays in arbitration and signal distortion, and increases throughput.
- Backwards compatibility: adapter cables allow FireWire 400 devices to operate under the FireWire 800 port (at FireWire 400 speed).

1.4.2. USB Cables and Connectors

USB is a serial input/output technology for connecting peripheral devices to a computer or to each other. Hi-Speed USB 2.0 is the latest implementation of this standard, and it provides the necessary bandwidth and data transfer rates to support high speed devices such as hard drives, CD/DVD drives and digital cameras.

Included USB Cable

Your LaCie drive is shipped with a Hi-Speed USB 2.0 cable, to ensure maximum data transfer performance when connected to a Hi-Speed USB 2.0 port. The cable will also work when connected to a USB port, but drive performance will be limited to USB 1.1 transfer rates.



Hi-Speed USB 2.0 Benefits

- Backwards compatibility: Hi-Speed USB 2.0 works with the original USB specifications.
- Hot-swappable: no need to shut down or restart your computer when adding or removing devices.

1.4.3. eSATA Cables and Connectors

Your LaCie d2 Quadra uses the latest in SATA technology, allowing interface (or bus) transfer rates of up to 3 Gbits/s. SATA technology was originally developed to serve as an internal interface, delivering improved performance to internal connections. Soon after, eSATA, or external SATA was developed, allowing for the use of shielded cables outside the PC.

eSATA technology was developed to be rugged and durable. eSATA connectors do not have the "L" shaped design of other SATA connectors. In addition, the guide features are vertically offset and reduced in size to prevent the use of unshielded internal cables in external applications.

Included eSATA Cable

Your LaCie drive is shipped with a eSATA cable, to ensure maximum data transfer performance when connected to a eSATA port.



eSATA Benefits

- eSATA interface can achieve up to 3 Gbits/s transfer rate.
- Plug orientation An extrusion on the outside of the connector helps guide and align the connector during insertion.
- Hot-plug support eSATA enables adding and removing a drive without having to power down the system or reboot.


1.5. Hard Disk Heat Management

Heat Dissipation Design

The LaCie d2 Quadra's metal body is ideal for naturally dissipating internal drive heat. Its unique design actually draws heat away from the internal drive toward the external casing. The large surface area of the heat sink casing absorbs internal heat and dissipates it, keeping the drive safe and prolonging its life and reliability. **As a consequence, it is normal that the external casing is warm to the touch.** Please make sure that the vent on the back-bezel is not obstructed and that there is a natural airflow across the casing.

Upright, Stack & Rackmount Configuration

Heat dissipation is maximized when the d2 Quadra is in the upright position. When stacking LaCie d2 Quadras, please remember to attach the included rubber feet on the under side of your drives. This will allow for some airflow between your drives so that the heat dissipation can work effectively. LaCie does not recommend stacking or racking more than three d2 drives on top of each other, especially if these drives are turned on simultaneously.



2. Getting Connected

Installing your LaCie d2 Quadra is easy thanks to LaCie Setup Assistant. Install your d2 Quadra in three easy steps:

- Step 1 Turn the drive on (section 2.1)
- Step 2 Connect an interface cable (section 2.2)
- Step 3 Run LaCie Setup Assistant to format your drive for optimal performance with your system (section 2.3)

IMPORTANT INFO: Do not connect more than one interface at a time. To switch interfaces, follow the steps in section 2.6. *Switching Interfaces*.

IMPORTANT INFO: Please follow the setup steps in the order they are given to ensure that the LaCie hard disk volume mounts correctly on your computer.

2.1. Turning the Drive On

To connect the power supply:


The power supply kit is composed of two cables: one cable (**A**) connects to the LaCie drive; and the other cable (**B**) connects to a power outlet, such as a wall outlet or a surge protector.

- 1. Connect Cable **A** to your LaCie hard disk.
- 2. Connect Cable **B** to the power supply brick (**C**).
- 3. Connect Cable **B** to a surge protector or wall outlet.
- Turn on the drive by moving the power switch on the back of the drive to the on or auto position.

CAUTION: Only use the AC adapter supplied with your specific LaCie hard disk. Do not use a power supply from another LaCie hard disk or another manufacturer. Using any other power cable or power supply may cause damage to the device and void your warranty.

Always remove the AC adapter before transporting your LaCie hard disk. Failure to remove the adapter may result in damage to your drive and will void your warranty.

TECHNICAL NOTE: You may use your LaCie hard disk when in a foreign country thanks to its 100-240 Volt power supply. To be able to use this feature, you may need to purchase an appropriate adapter or cord. LaCie accepts no responsibility for any damage to the drive resulting from the use of an inappropriate adapter. Using an adapter other than one authorized by LaCie will void your warranty.



2.2. Connecting the Interface Cable

IMPORTANT INFO: Please connect the power supply before connecting the interface cable to ensure that the volume mounts correctly on your computer.

To connect the interface cable:

- 1. Connect one end of the interface cable (USB, FireWire 400, FireWire 800 or eSATA) to your computer.
- 2. Connect the other end of the interface cable to the matching port on the LaCie hard disk (Fig. 2.2).
- After a few seconds, a small LaCie parition will mount on your computer and appear in My Computer (Windows users) or on your desktop (Mac users).
- 4. Proceed to section 2.3. Launching LaCie Setup Assistant.



2.3. Launching LaCie Setup Assistant

Before using your drive, LaCie Setup Assistant software must be launched to format your drive. It will:

- Optimize your drive according to your needs
- Copy the manual and utilities onto your LaCie hard disk

IMPORTANT INFO: LaCie recommends that you copy the user manual and utilities onto your computer's internal hard drive or other medium when setup is complete.

To launch LaCie Setup Assistant:

Windows users: double click on the LaCie icon in "My Computer" (or in "Computer" for Windows Vista users).

Mac users: double click on the "LaCie Setup Assistant" icon which will appear on your desktop.

IMPORTANT INFO: If you do not launch LaCie Setup Assistant or if you quit LaCie Setup Assistant after the formatting has begun, your drive will not be ready to use and will require manual formatting. The user manual and utilities will not be available on your drive and will have to be downloaded from the LaCie website: www.lacie.com

TECHNICAL NOTE: The LaCie Setup Assistant does not prevent you from using your computer's native disk utility program to format or partition your LaCie drive. Simply follow the Setup Assistant through completion, then use your computer's native disk utility (Disk Management for Windows or Disk Utility for Mac) to reformat your drive. See section 3. Optional Formatting and Partitioning for more information.

2.4. Connecting Multiple Devices

FireWire 400 and FireWire 800 interfaces allow you to connect another hard drive, a DVD \pm RW writer or a digital video camera directly to the LaCie d2 Quadra (this connection is called "daisy-chaining").

To daisy-chain devices, you must be using the same interface (FireWire). Your computer will not recognize the daisy-chained device if the interfaces are mixed, i.e. a FireWire device attached to a drive that is connected to the computer via the Hi-Speed USB 2.0 interface.

TECHNICAL NOTE: When you daisy-chain using a mix of interfaces (FireWire 400 and FireWire 800) the resultant speed will be limited to the lowest common denominator (FireWire 400 speeds).

 Connect your LaCie d2 Quadra's power supply and host computer interface by following the steps in sections 2.1 to 2.3.

2. To attach a digital video camera*:

- a. Using the iLink/DV cable (sold separately), connect the 4-pin end of the cable to the 4-pin port on your digital camera.
- b. Connect the 6-pin end of the iLink/DV cable to the 6-pin FireWire port on the back of the LaCie Hard drive (C).

To attach a FireWire peripheral:

- a. Connect the FireWire 400 or 800 cable into an available FireWire 400 or 800 port on your FireWire peripheral.
- b. Attach the other end of the FireWire 400 or 800 cable to an available FireWire 400 or 800 port on the LaCie d2 Quadra (C).
- 3. The digital camera should now appear under My Computer (Windows users) or on the desktop (Mac users).

^{*}Some cameras do not support this configuration or may downgrade your LaCie d2 Quadra's performance.

2.5. Disconnecting Your LaCie d2 Quadra

USB external devices feature "plug & play" connectivity, which means that your drive can be connected and disconnected while the computer is running. To prevent failures, however, it is important to follow these steps when disconnecting your LaCie hard disk.



Windows Users

- From the System Tray (located in the lower righthand side of your screen), click the Eject icon (a small green arrow over a hardware image).
- A message will appear, listing the devices the Eject icon controls (it should say, "Safely remove..."). Click on the LaCie hard disk in this prompt.
- 3. This message will appear: "Safe to Remove Hardware" (or similar). It is now safe to disconnect the device.



2.6. Switching Interfaces

FireWire, eSATA and USB external devices feature "plug & play" connectivity, which means that your drive can be connected and disconnected while the computer is running. To prevent failures, however, it is important to unmount or safely disconnect your drive before switching interfaces. See section 2.5. Disconnecting Your LaCie d2 Quadra, for proper disconnection procedures.



3. Optional Formatting and Partitioning

The first time you use your LaCie hard disk, LaCie Setup Assistant formats your drive according to your needs. If your needs change, you can reformat your LaCie Hard Disk to optimize it for use with Windows or Mac, or for cross-platform use. For example, if you used LaCie Setup Assistant to format your drive to work with your Mac (HFS+), but now you want to share your hard disk with Windows users, you can reformat it to FAT 32 (MS-DOS) for this purpose.

You may need to format your LaCie hard disk if LaCie Setup Assistant was interrupted or stopped. If the hard disk does not appear in My Computer (Windows) or on the desktop (Mac), it may not be formatted properly. **IMPORTANT INFO: Please copy the User Manual and utilities to your computer before reformatting**. Reformatting will erase everything from the hard disk. If you have other data that you want to protect or continue to use, copy this information to your computer before reformatting.

What is Formatting?

When a disk is formatted, the following things occur: the operating system erases all of the bookkeeping information on the disk, tests the disk to make sure that all of the sectors are reliable, marks bad sectors (i.e., those that are scratched) and creates internal address tables that it later uses to locate information. A hard disk must be formatted before it can be used to store data.

What is Partitioning?

You can also divide the hard disk into sections, called partitions. A partition is a section of the hard disk's storage capacity that is created to contain files and data. For instance, you could create three partitions on your drive: one partition for your office documents, one as a backup and one for your multimedia files. Or, if you will be sharing the drive with another person in your household or office, you can create a partition for each person who uses the drive. Partitioning is optional.

File System Formats

There are three different file system format categories: NTFS, FAT 32 (MS-DOS), and Mac OS Extended (HFS+). Use the information below to determine which format is best for you.

Use NTFS if...

...you will be using the drive only with Windows 2000, Windows XP or Windows Vista (performance will generally be greater when compared to FAT 32). This file system is compatible in read only mode with Mac OS X 10.3 and higher.

Use HFS+ if...

...you will be using the drive on Macs only; performance will generally be greater when compared to FAT 32. This file system is NOT compatible with Windows OS.

Use FAT 32 (MS-DOS) if...

...you will be using your drive with both Windows and Mac OS X 10.3 or sharing the drive between Windows 2000 and Windows XP or Windows Vista. Maximum single file size is 4GB.

3.1. Finding the File System Format

You may need to know the current file system format of your LaCie hard disk if:

- You want to reformat your LaCie hard disk. The current file system format may determine the process you'll use to reformat it.
- The LaCie hard disk does not appear to mount on your computer. In this case, the file system format may prevent your operating system from recognizing the LaCie hard disk (ex. If you connect a hard disk formatted in HFS+ to a Windows computer).



Windows Users

- Right-click My Computer and select Manage from the right-click options menu. The Computer Management window opens.
- 2. Select **Disk Management** under Storage (you may have to expand the Storage list to see the Disk Management option). Information about all storage devices connected to your computer appears in the right hand pane.
- 3. Find the disk corresponding to your LaCie hard disk.

NOTE: "Disk 0" is your computer's internal hard disk. If other storage devices are connected to your computer, refer to the disk information in the upper pane to determine which disk is your LaCie hard disk.

4. The File System column in the upper pane lists the file system of each disk. Disks are listed as "NTFS", "FAT32" or blank (if the file system format is not recognizes, such as if it is HFS+).



Mac Users

- 1. Select Utilites from the Go menu in Finder.
- 2. Open Disk Utility.
- 3. In the disk list on the left side of the Disk Utility window, find the disk corresponding to your LaCie hard disk.
- 4. Each disk has at least two listings, one representing the device itself and one representing each partition on the disk. Select one of the lower, indented partitions.
- 5. Refer to the **Format** line of the information area at the bottom of the Disk Utility window.

3.2. Formatting for Windows Users

Before you start, connect the drive to the computer and follow the steps in section 3.1. to find the file system format of your LaCie hard disk.

- If your disk is formatted as a FAT32 volume, proceed to section 3.2.1. Formatting from FAT32 to NTFS.
- If your disk is formatted as an HFS+ volume (or unrecognized in Windows) , click here or proceed to section 3.2.2.
 Formatting from HFS+.

3.2.1. Formatting from FAT32 to NTFS

Follow these steps if you used LaCie Setup Assistant to create an exchange volume on your LaCie Hard Disk for data sharing between Windows and Mac computers or if you reformatted your LaCie Hard Disk as a FAT32 volume on a Mac.

CAUTION: Following these steps will erase everything from the hard disk. If you have information that you want to protect or continue to use, back up this information before performing these steps.


- Right-click **My Computer** and select **Manage** (Fig. 3.2.1-A). The Computer Management window opens.
- Select **Disk Management** under Storage (you may have to expand the Storage list to see the Disk Management option). See Fig. 3.2.1-B. Information about all storage devices connected to your computer appears in the pane on the right.
- Find the disk corresponding to your LaCie hard disk. Rightclick in the disk allocation bar of the FAT32 volume and select **Format...** from the right-click options menu (Fig. 3.2.1-B).

TECHNICAL NOTE: If you did not create an exchange volume using LaCie Setup Assistant, there may be only one volume associated with the disk.

- 4. In the Format window:
 - a. Enter a name for the disk as you'd like it to appear on your computer in the **Volume label** field.
 - b. Select "Perform a quick format".
 - c. Leave the other options at their default values and click $\ensuremath{\textbf{OK}}.$
- Click OK in the format warning dialog. During the formatting process, the status of the disk changes to "Formatting" in the Computer Management window. When Formatting is complete, the status changes to "Healthy". See Fig. 3.2.1-D.

3.2.2. Formatting from HFS+ (Apple File System) to NTFS

Follow the steps in this section if you used LaCie Setup Assistant to format your drive for use with a Mac or if you reformatted your LaCie hard disk as an HFS+ volume on a Mac.

CAUTION: Following these steps will erase everything from the hard disk. If you have information that you want to protect or continue to use, back up this information before performing these steps.

- Right-click **My Computer** and select **Manage** (Fig. 3.2.2-A). The Computer Management window opens.
- Select **Disk Management** under Storage (you may have to expand the Storage list to see the Disk Management option). See Fig. 3.2.2-B. Information about all storage devices connected to your computer appears in the pane on the right.
- Find the disk corresponding to your LaCie hard disk. Rightclick on the "Unallocated" volume in the disk allocation bar and select **New Partition...** from the right-click options menu (Fig. 3.2.2-B). The New Partition Wizard opens.

3.3. Formatting for Mac Users

CAUTION: Following these steps will erase everything from the hard disk. If you have information that you want to protect or continue to use, back up this information before performing these steps.

- 1. Select **Utilites** from the Go menu in Finder.
- 2. Open Disk Utility.
- 3. In the disk list on the left side of the Disk Utility window, find the disk corresponding to your LaCie hard disk. For each disk there is a listing for the drive controller and one for each volume on the disk. Select the listing for the controller (ex. "153.4 GB HDT72251..." in Fig. 3.3-A).
- 4. Select the **Partition** tab.
- 5. From the Volume Scheme menu, choose the number of partitions you want to divide the drive into (16 maximum). You can adjust the size of each partition using the slide bar between the partitions in the Volume Scheme area.
- In the Volume Information section, enter a name for each volume (partition) and choose the volume format (Mac OS Extended, Mac OS Standard, UNIX File System, or MS-DOS).

TECHNICAL NOTE: To share a volume with Windows users, select MS-DOS (FAT32) format.

IMPORTANT INFO: Apple recommends that unless you have a specific reason to use the UNIX File System (UFS), you should use the Mac OS Extended format because it provides a more familiar experience to Macintosh users.

- Click Partition. Click Partition again to close the alert message and continue.
- Mac Disk Utility will format and partition the disk according to your settings, and your drive will be ready to use.




